Dear DiGRA 2020 authors,

We hope this finds you well. This is a gentle reminder that the DiGRA proceedings deadline is a week away, 31 July 2020 (UTC+14:00).

As authors of accepted papers and extended abstracts, you are eligible to have your work published as part of the DiGRA 2020 proceedings. Alternatively, you can withdraw your paper.

If you wish to be included in the proceedings, please make sure you have uploaded your camera-ready paper on EasyChair AND paid your membership fee by 31 July 2020.

All accepted full papers and extended abstracts remaining in the DiGRA 2020 EasyChair by that date will be considered final and included in the proceedings after membership payment confirmation by the same date. One membership payment per submission is required (this also goes for papers with multiple authors).

Regarding membership payment, please follow the instructions on the DiGRA website:

Regardless of your option, we need you to access EasyChair and withdraw or update your submission by the deadline.

To do so,

- 1) log into your EasyChair account with the email address you used when submitting your paper
- 2) click on the magnifying glass icon to access the submission page
- 3) from the top right corner, select "update file" or "withdraw" according to your preference.

Some things to remember when preparing your camera-ready version:

- 1) make sure your new changes follow the DiGRA guidelines. Find the template here: <https://digra2020.org/submissions/>
- 2) de-anonymise your paper
- 3) consider updating your bibliography to acknowledge BIPOC & non-male voices in game studies.
